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
Have you ever imagined how your favourite colour tastes?

Dark blue holds a dual identity, with half of its associations linked to savoury elements due to its connection with seawater and the other half to extreme sweetness, reminiscent of candies, cakes, or jams.

Symbolically, this shade represents knowledge and science, epitomised by the iconic emblem of medicine: the caduceus.

Dark blue captures the essence of savoury and sweet, blending them into a harmonious balance reflecting wisdom and discovery.

Valued for its bold tone, purple has been associated with royalty since ancient times. Persian King Cyrus wore a purple tunic to symbolise his status. Roman emperors forbade citizens from wearing purple under penalty of death.

Like its lighter tint, violet, purple is associated with floral notes—specifically, the floral characteristics of pomelo, bergamot, and grape.

This regal colour embodies a sense of historical splendour and offers a sophisticated combination of floral and fruity notes.

Light yellow is commonly associated with citrus and, to a lesser extent, tropical fruits like passion fruit, pineapple, and mango.

In the West, the colour was historically linked to cowardice, with the term 'yellow' stemming from the habits of the Yellow-Bellied Sapsucker, a bird known for hiding in trees. However, this tint also symbolises brightness and vitality. The tang of citrus and the appeal of tropical fruits combine to reflect the vibrant energy of sunlit days.


