CHIESA DI SAN LUIGI DEI FRANCESI

Piazza di S. Luigi de' Francesi



The Church of San Luigi dei Francesi is one of the most important churches in Rome, located near Piazza Navona. It is especially famous for its extraordinary frescoes and paintings by Caravaggio, particularly the works *The Calling of Saint Matthew*, *Saint Matthew and the Angel*, and *The Martyrdom of Saint Matthew*, which are found in the Contarelli Chapel. These masterpieces are considered some of the painter's finest artworks and mark a key moment in the evolution of his career.

The church is significant not only for its artistic beauty but also because it serves as the place of worship for the French community in Rome, and its architecture reflects the influence of France in the Roman context.

BASILICA DI SANT'AGOSTINO

Piazza di S. Agostino

The Basilica of Sant'Agostino in Rome is an important church located near Piazza Navona. It is significant for its historical and artistic value. Inside, it houses the Madonna del Parto, a renowned fresco by Caravaggio, and the tomb of the famous Renaissance sculptor Raffaello Sanzio, although his remains were later moved to the Pantheon.

The Basilica is also home to the relics of Saint Monica, mother of Saint Augustine, making it a significant site for both art and religious history. Its blend of artistic treasures and spiritual significance attracts both tourists and pilgrims alike.
