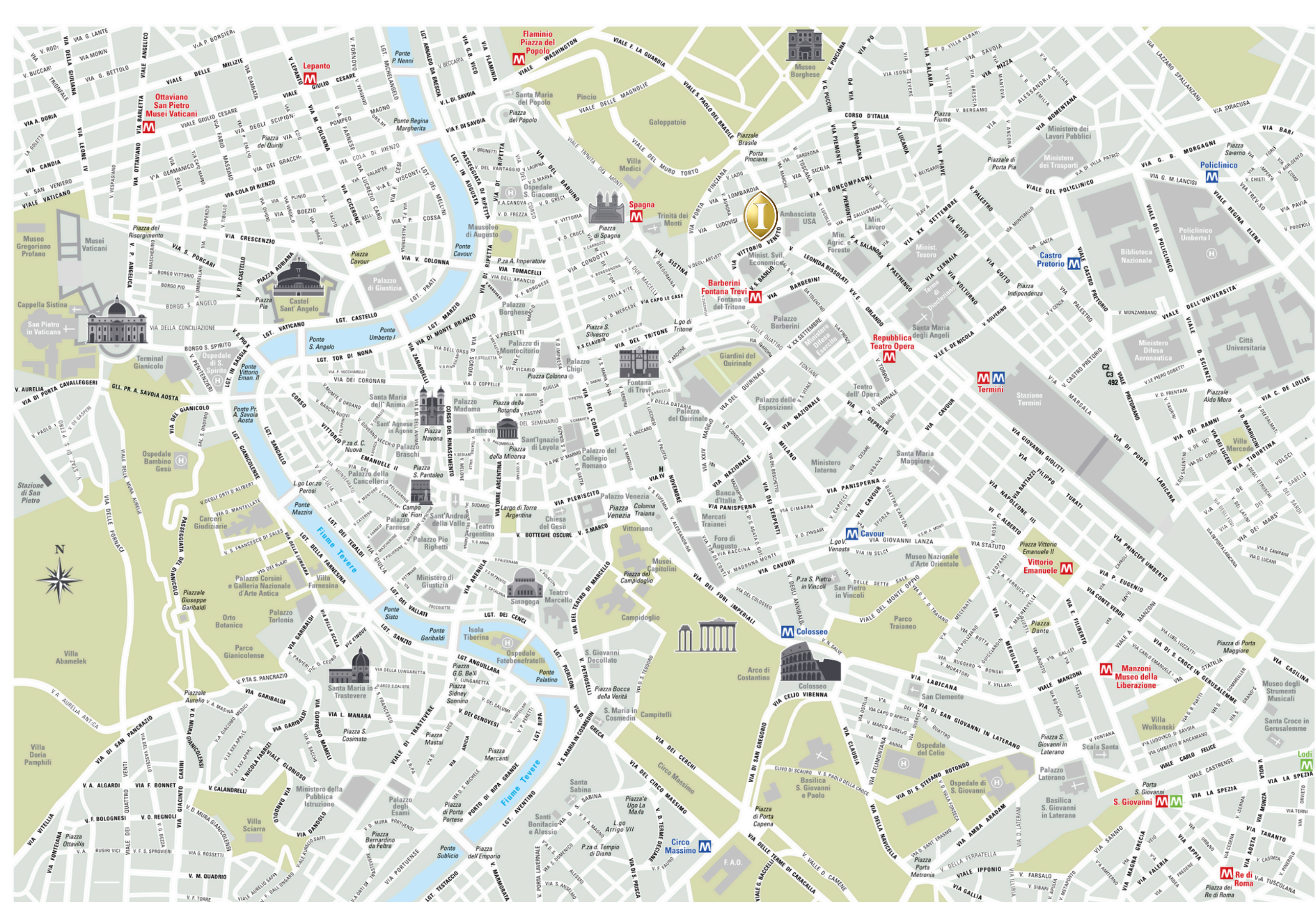




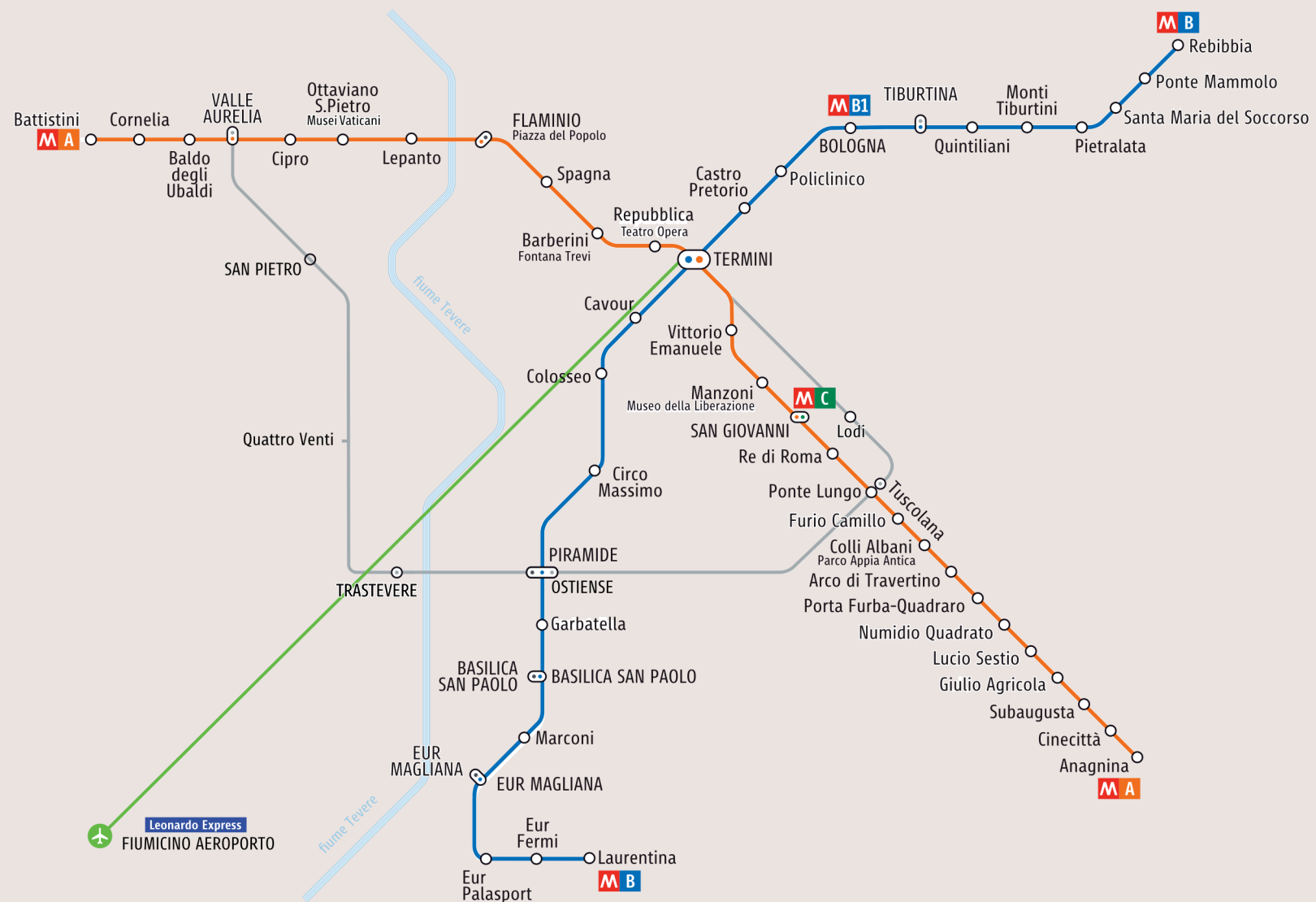

Via dei Condotti

Luxury Shopping

Located near the Spanish Steps, this is home to some of the world's most luxurious Italian and international fashion houses. Whether you are looking for the latest fashion trends or classic Italian pieces, Via dei Condotti is the perfect place to shop and is within walking distance from the InterContinental Rome Ambasciatori Palace.

Via Cola di Rienzo

EAT & DRINK

Rome is known for its delicious and unique cuisine. The city is packed with restaurants, cafes, and bars that serve traditional Roman food. Some of the must-try dishes are Spaghetti alla Carbonara, a classic dish of spaghetti tossed in a rich and creamy egg sauce, with Pecorino cheese and crispy pork cheek; Bucatini all'Amatriciana, pasta with a tomato-based sauce and cured pork cheek; Tonnarelli Cacio e Pepe, a simple dish of pasta, black pepper, and Pecorino cheese; and the Suppli, deep-fried balls of rice and mozzarella.

Trastevere

a charming and vibrant neighborhood in Rome known for its lively atmosphere and endless dining options. The streets are lined with traditional trattorias and restaurants, as well as casual pizzerias and cafes.

Testaccio

Located near the ancient site of the Circus Maximus, it is known for its open-air markets. The area is home to a range of restaurants and pastry

shops, serving both traditional Roman and international cuisine. It is a lively area that is also known for its dynamic nightlife with several bars, clubs, and pubs which offer a range of different atmospheres and music.

Jewish Ghetto

DISCOVER ROME

Colosseum

As one of the most iconic structures in the world, it is a must-see destination when visiting the Eternal City. The ancient amphitheatre served as a venue for gladiatorial contests, public exhibitions, and other events.

Spanish Steps

With its 135 steps, the Spanish Steps is an unmissable place, and you have to climb it at least once. It starts with the wonderful Barcaccia fountain at the foot, which has been created by Gian Lorenzo Bernini, and ends with the church of Trinità dei Monti at the top.

Trevi Fountain

The fountain stands 26 meters high and is the largest Baroque fountain in the city. According to legend, if you throw a coin into the fountain with your right hand over your left shoulder, you will definitely return to the Eternal City one day.

St. Peter’s Basilica

It is one of the oldest churches in Rome and one of the most important religious sites in the world. It houses some of the most famous works of art in the world, including Michelangelo’s Pietà and Bernini’s Baldacchino.

Pantheon

It was created as a temple and later became a Basilica. Enclosed are the tombs of all the kings of Italy and that of Raphael, the famous Italian Renaissance painter. What is striking about this place is its impressive architecture and pierced dome.

Gianicolo

It is one of the best vantage points in the city with a breathtaking view of Rome! Take a stroll through the park and enjoy the serenity of this peaceful oasis in the heart of Rome.

LOCAL KNOWLEDGE

Cheers

When Italians greet each other, they typically kiss on both cheeks and hug. You can greet someone by saying the following: “Ciao!” (Hello!), “Buongiorno!” (Good morning!) from early morning until midday, or “Buonasea” (Good evening) from midday until late evening.

Gratuities

In Italy, it is customary to leave a gratuity after receiving a service. The amount of the gratuity is usually 10-15% of the total cost of the service. In restaurants, it is customary to leave the gratuity on the table rather than handing it directly to the server.

Weather

Rome has a Mediterranean climate, with hot, dry summers and mild, rainy winters.

Attire

When visiting churches, women should avoid wearing shorts or skirts that are above the knee and revealing tops. Men should avoid wearing shorts and tank tops. It is also important to remove hats and sunglasses when entering a church.

Getting Around

You can get around Rome by walking, taking public transport, or by taxi. The Eternal City has an extensive public transportation network, with buses, trams, metros, and trains throughout the whole city. Tickets can be purchased at any of the metro stations or at newspaper kiosks and tobacco shops.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited in public places in Italy, including bars, restaurants, and public transportation. It is also illegal to smoke in the presence of minors and within a 10-meter radius of a hospital, school, or playground. Those caught smoking in prohibited areas could be charged with fines.
